The Administrative Council meeting June 27 looked forward to opportunities for community involvement.

The young people working in the Music Camp this summer with Keeley Coon's leadership will present "The Little Mermaid" at the Eureka High School at 7:00 pm on July 21 and at 2:00 pm on July 22. Keeley has asked the church to provide cookie refreshments at the performances and Cindy Knotts will be accepting donations.

Our Sunday worship services are being received by growing numbers after 3 years through social media. We have 280 followers on Facebook. The council voted to purchase a new sound mixer to continue this important outreach.

The council approved a request to host the School Supply Drive which is coordinated by volunteers, social service agencies, and the local school district. On Sunday, August 6 the church will provide a light lunch to parents and children who come and help them feel welcome during their sometimes tedious collection of proper supplies. The council encouraged all church members and guests to attend the on line Leadership Institute provided by the Church of the Resurrection on September 27 (evening), 28 (all day) and 29 (morning). We can attend virtually in our Fellowship Hall. The Council voted to pay \$40 per person which reduces the cost for willing individuals. GREAT PLAINS ANNUAL CONFERENCE


The annual conference of the Great Plains UMC Conference was held June 7 – 10 in LaVista, Nebraska. The theme was "Clay in the Hands of our Creator". We can learn much of the proceedings from the videos and reports on-line. https://www.greatplainsumc.org/annualconference

Bishop Wilson's native American legacy was reflected in the discussions and he was praised for his leadership of the Ks/Neb conference in times of division and stress, as retired Bishop Blake urged members to "not to be distracted by thunder and lightning of exclusion, division, and intolerance", but to "sing louder in the storm".

The Great Plains conference includes 750 churches and is shifting the concentration of Methodists to the Midwest. There may be a consideration of redrawing district lines in the future.
